- 1) **Asian Songwriting Challenge:** Tertiary and secondary school students will be invited to send an original song based on a provided signature beat. The winning song will be selected based on its appeal to the masses and will be showcased at the DBS Marina Regatta and the top three teams will take home over SGD 4,500 in cash and prizes.
- 2) **Dance and Cheerleading Challenge:** The dance and cheerleading challenge will feature rousing repertoires by schools and clubs. The selected teams will battle it out at the DBS Marina Regatta for a chance to take home close to SGD 10,000 in cash and prizes.
- 3) **DBS Movies by the Bay:** The 19th edition of DBS Movies by the Bay will be held on the pre-opening day of the regatta, 29 May. Members of the public will be given the opportunity to choose from four movies via dbsmoviesbythebay.com, with the two most popular making it to the live screening on 29 and 30 May.
- 4) **DBS Family Day:** Held on 31 May, the DBS Family Day will be held together with DBS Marina Regatta. From 2pm - 6pm on Sunday, 31st May, DBS employees will enjoy a fun-filled afternoon with a 'mobile massage team' from Singapore Association for the Visually Handicapped, outdoor laser tag, gladiator jousting, urban farming workshops, extreme sports, delectable food and many more exciting activities and performances. Staff will get exclusive discounts and gifts at the regatta.
- 5) **Urban farming workshops:** The Regatta will hold free urban farming workshops will be held for those interested in learning how "grow their own food" in their homes or offices. The workshops will be conducted by social enterprises Edible Garden City and Comcrop.
- 6) **DBS Marina Regatta Cosplay Cup:** The DBS Marina Regatta Cosplay Cup will feature talents from across the region. Fans will also witness the final act of an online manga series created for the DBS Marina Regatta, which will come to life at the festival.
- 7) **SG's first pop-up urban beach:** For the very first time in Singapore – a pop-up urban beach complete with palm trees, deck chairs, and a beach bar in the heart of Marina Bay. Measuring 50m by 50m, the beach will be located at The Promontory@Marina Bay during the third weekend of the DBS Marina Regatta from 13 to 14 June 2015. The beach will also feature a 25m by 15m pool where a host of activities including stand-up paddling and stand-up yoga will take place.
- 8) **Paddle for Good:** DBS Marina Regatta event-goers are challenged to form teams with and paddle alongside persons with disabilities (PwDs), such as the members from the Deaf Dragons team. "Paddle for Good" simulates a dragon boat race, but on land with the use of indoor ergometer machines instead of boats. For every 1 kilometre paddled, DBS will donate SGD 100 to organisations that are committed to creating and running sports activities for PwDs. Donations will be matched dollar-for-dollar by the Care and Share movement led by Community Chest.
- 9) **DBS Food Village by Savour:** Expect world-class dishes brought to you by local award-winning chefs such as Chef David, Chef Consultant at Onion Restaurant Group, who has been a personal chef for many luminaries including President George Bush, Michael Douglas and Catherine Zeta-Jones; Chef Emmanuel Stroobant, who runs his eponymous corporation of 8 different contemporary restaurants and lifestyle brand in Singapore and was named World Gourmet Summit's 'Chef of the Year' for 2002 and 2006.

- 10) **DBS Art Park:** The DBS Art Park will showcase eight up and coming artists aged 18-35 from NOISE who will be working on four giant – measuring close to 2m by 2m – art cubes. AsNo Dolnk, two times Singapore Graffiti champion, will lead another group of four artists, under Skcratch Army, on the development of the fifth cube. In addition to making different forms of art more accessible to the public and adding colour to the event, this is also a great showcase of Singaporeans' creativity as athletes, officials and supporters visit Singapore's Marina Bay, one of the key competition sites for the SEA Games.
- 11) **Living Art:** As part of our partnership with the National Gallery Singapore, we are also hosting Living Art at the DBS Marina Regatta. Living Art is a re-enactment of a selected painting, that will be on display at the National Gallery Singapore. At the Regatta, actors will bring to life renowned artist Liu Kang's painting "Life by the River". Life by the River will be displayed at the DBS Singapore Gallery at the National Gallery Singapore from October 2015.
